### PROJECT FUNDING PRINCIPLES AND GUIDELINES

The GHFP is primarily interested in funding projects that directly contribute to its mission and objectives, and fall within the GHFP's Areas of Concern.

A. The GHFP prefers to fund projects or programmes that

- are highly cost-effective and, after initial help, become self-funding or will become sustainable
- have a large multiplier effect in the areas of education, peace, inter-religious dialogue, livelihood and human development
- have already secured other sources of funding and are looking for complementary grants
- have a concrete, measurable outcomes at a point of time

B. Generally, the GHFP will not

- will not fund business proposals
- will not fund personal needs, including studies, training, or other self-improvement needs

C. The GHFP will sign a funding agreement with successful applicants. The funding agreement sets out the duties and responsibilities of both parties, as well as the project reporting process.
